MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE PAKISTAN COUNCIL OF ARCHITECTS AND TOWN PLANNERS HELD ON FRIDAY, MARCH 26, 2010 AT 1730 HRS AT KDA OFFICERS CLUB, MINI LAWN, KASHMIR ROAD, KARACHI.

In accordance with the notice, the Annual General Meeting of the Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners was held at 1730 hrs on Friday, March 26, 2010 at KDA Officers Club, Mini Law, Kashmir Road, Karachi under the Chairmanship of Ar. Shama Usman.

**1.0 AGENDA NO.1 RECITATION FROM THE HOLY QURAN**

1.1 With the permission of the Chairperson, the meeting commenced with the recitation from the Holy Quran by Ar. Tahir Khatak.

1.2 After the recitation from the Holy Quran, the Registrar requested the participants to offer Fateha for the following departed members of the Council:

1. Ar. Misbah Najmi
2. Ar. Arshad Abdulla
3. Ar. Azad Thariani

1.3 The Chairperson, Ar. Shama Usman, welcomed all the members of the Council and requested the Registrar to formally proceed with the agenda. A list of members of the Council who attended the proceedings of the Annual General Meeting is attached as Annexure A with these Minutes.

**2.0 AGENDA NO.2 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON MARCH 13, 2009**

2.1 The Registrar informed the meeting that the Minutes of the last AGM are attached as Annex A in the Annual Report 2009. The Registrar informed the participants that, as per prescribed rules and procedure, the office had circulated the meeting minutes of the last Annual General Meeting. However, the Council has not received any comments, during the stipulated time; therefore, the Minutes stand approved.

**RESOLUTION NO.1**

On a motion moved by Ar. Farhat Ullah Qureshi and seconded by Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan, the House unanimously confirmed the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting, held on March 13, 2009.

**3.0 AGENDA NO.3 PRESENTATION OF ANNUAL REPORT OF THE  
COUNCIL**

3.1 The Registrar, through PowerPoint Presentation, briefed the audience about the salient features of the Annual Report 2009. She informed the house that the report, a copy of which was already distributed among the participants, covered all the major activities of the Council during the year 2009.

3.2 The Registrar informed that during the year under report, the present Executive Committee held three meetings. The first meeting was organized at Rawalpindi in April 2009, while the remaining two were held at Karachi in October 2009 and March 2010 respectively.

3.3 The Registrar said that the Executive Committee of the Council would like to record its gratitude and appreciation to those architects, who were part of the Design Competitions as Jury Members, for taking time out from their busy schedules and for their generosity and kindness for donating the entire amount of their professional fee to the Council. She also acknowledged the generous contribution of the Executive Committee Members, primarily architects, as they have never claimed any travel reimbursement. The Registrar also acknowledged the contribution of the University of Engineering and Technology (UET), Lahore and National College of Arts (NCA), Lahore for supporting the Council's Educational Nominees, and Capital Development Authority (CDA) for supporting the Executive Committee Member Planning.

3.4 It was informed that during the Year 2009 the Council had received a total number of 211 applications, including 183 architects and 28 town planners. Out of this, the Council had registered 173 architects and 21 town planners. 17 applications, including 10 architects and 07 town planners, have been deferred due to incomplete documentation. The Registrar informed that the total number of architects registered with the Council is 3104 while 725 are registered as town planners with the Council. The Registrar informed that out of 3104 paid up architects 1920 are paid up members while the rest are removed from the Register. Furthermore, out of 725 registered town planners only 319 are paid up members of the Council. She further informed that in 2008 the total percentage of paid up architect was 57% while in 2009 the percentage was increased by 5% and stood at 62%. Similarly, in 2008 the total percentage of paid up town planners was 36% while in 2009 the percentage was increased by 8% and stood at 44%. It was also informed that by the end of 2009, 709 architects and 100 town planners had opted lifetime membership.

3.5 It was informed that the Ministry of Environment, Government of Pakistan, through a letter, F.NO. 1 (1)/2008-RP dated 20<sup>th</sup> June 2009, has approved the recommendation made by the Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners

(PCATP) for the recognition of Institute of Architects Pakistan (IAP) and Institute of Planners Pakistan (IPP) as Professional Institutes and Arms of PCATP.

3.6 The Registrar of the Council informed that during the last year 08 new architectural schools contacted the PCATP for accreditation. Out of 08 schools, 04 had submitted the formal application for accreditation. After a careful appraisal, the Council has scheduled visit to two institutions. Furthermore, the Council has also scheduled revalidation visits to 04 architectural schools in February and March 2010. It was further informed that accreditation process of 02 schools is in pending and their case will be presented in Accreditation Board Meeting, scheduled to be held in May 2010. It was also informed that during the reporting period the Council also took part in workshop, organized by the Quality Assurance Agency of the Higher Education Commission (HEC), with a view to train Master Trainers on Accreditation and Self Assessment.

3.7 The Registrar informed that it was observed with concern that there are no standardized criteria of jurors to attend the final year thesis jury; therefore, architecture schools have no choice but to apply their own criteria for inviting jurors. While realizing the problem, the Council in collaboration with the heads of the architectural schools has formulated the external jurors of the final year thesis.

3.8 The house was informed that the PCATP was commissioned by the Ministry of Culture, Government of Pakistan to organize and conduct a two-stage nation wide Architectural Design Competition for the Construction of Mohtarma Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Monument/Memorial at Liaquat Bagh, Rawalpindi. Furthermore, during the year under report, the Council came to know, either through newspapers or from registered members that some public as well as private organizations invited Architects or Town Planners to submit design proposals/expression of interest, without contacting and following the PCATP criteria/rules in this regard. The Council, in response, contacted 06 organizations and recommended them to adopt the proper procedure, if they wish to invite design proposals.

3.9 It was informed that the Honorable High Court of Sindh through a Judgment directed the PCATP to check and regulate the professional standards. While responding on the directions of Sindh High Court the Council has established "Vigilance Committees" with a view to conduct visits to government and private offices to verify the professional practices/standards and registration status of working professionals. In this regard, two public notices were published in leading newspapers.

3.10 The Registrar informed that during the reporting period, the Council received a number of requests from the Court of Law seeking the professional advice of registered architects and town planners in various cases. The PCATP nominees represented the Council in 12 court cases.

3.11 It was informed that during the last year the Council developed and brought three issues of PCATP E/Newsletter, a quarterly publication of the Council. Furthermore, the Council has also prepared and published Silver Directory of Architects and Town Planners.

3.12 The Registrar informed that during 2009, the Council has assigned a consultancy to M/s. Arif Shah Associates to prepare a set of contract documents with a view to facilitate its members. The draft of the consultancy is attached with the Annual Report 2009. The Registrar invited the participants to send their comments, if any, on the said draft within fifteen days of the Annual General Meeting 2009.

3.13 It was also informed that last year the Council decided to propose amendments in 1983 Ordinance. For the said purpose, the Council organized two meetings in Karachi and Lahore respectively. The Registrar also invited the participants to send their comments, if any, on the proposed amendments within fifteen days of the Annual General Meeting 2009.

3.14 The Registrar informed the house that while realizing the need to restructure the service rules and contracts of the PCATP staff, the office of the Council has developed the required documents and presented it before the Executive Committee Meeting (ECM) held in Karachi on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2010. The Registrar also informed the house that the PCATP staff service rules were already approved by the Executive Committee in October 2009.

3.15 Ar. Shah Muhammad Misbah applauded the efforts of the Council for doing such remarkable work; however, he suggested that the Annual Report should be available before the Annual General Meeting so the members have ample time to read and respond appropriately. The Executive Committee appreciated the suggestion; however, the Registrar informed the house that the Annual Report 2009 was uploaded to the PCATP's website two week before the holding of Annual General Meeting.

3.16 Dr. Anis, Head of the Architecture Department, Punjab University, informed the podium that the name of his school was not included in the list of those institutions, who have applied for accreditation with the PCATP. He showed his apprehension about the comments made by a senior architect to some of his students regarding the accreditation status of his department. The Registrar informed Dr. Anis that the Architecture Department of Punjab University had applied for accreditation in 2008, while the names presented in 2009 Annual Report only included those institutions who had applied in 2009. Therefore, the name of Architecture Department, Punjab University was not present.

**4.0 AGENDA NO.4                      PRESENTATION OF THE AUDITED ACCOUNTS  
OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR  
2008-2009**

4.1 The Audited Accounts were presented before the members to make any comments. The Registrar informed the members that the Council is pleased to inform that during the reporting period the Council has over seven hundred thousand surplus.

**RESOLUTION NO.2**

On a motion moved by Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan and seconded by Ar. Shah Muhammad Misbah, the Council adopted and approved the audited accounts of the Council for the year 2008-2009.

**5.0 AGENDA NO.5                      PRESENTATION OF THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF  
THE COUNCIL FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2009-  
2010**

5.1 The Registrar informed the members that while following the example of preceding years, the Council has annexed the detailed anticipated and actual budget in Annual Report. The Registrar invited the members to examine the balance sheet and make comments, if they have on the budget.

5.2 Ar. Zahid Javed Raja showed his concern on over-spending of the Council against the previous allocated budget of the Council. He also pointed out that the anticipated budget for the next fiscal year also showed a shortfall. He opined that the shortfall showed lack of financial planning on the part of the Executive Committee of the Council.

5.3 The Registrar of the Council informed Ar. Zahid Javed Raja that the Council is strictly following a strict financial policy. She further informed that Ar. Samar Ali Khan, Vice-Chairman Architecture, weekly visits the PCATP office and monitor financial affairs regularly. The Registrar also informed that sharing of quarterly accounts reports with the Chairperson and Vice Chairman, both architecture and town planning, of the Council is a regular feature of her office work. She also informed that the publication of two public notices, on the instructions of Sindh High Court, in leading newspapers had forced the Council to spend hefty amount on it. The Registrar also informed that the Council, in order to facilitate its members to provide contract documents, has given a consultancy to M/s. Arif Shah Associates. She added that the said consultancy was not part of the last years' anticipated budget. Additionally, the Registrar said that during the reporting period the Council spent much amount on account of legal professional services. Furthermore, she elaborated that devaluation of rupee and increased inflationary trends had almost doubled the prices of all essential items; therefore, there is an increase in office expences.

5.4 However, the Registrar pointed out that the Council is also concerned of the fact of the increasing financial expenditures; therefore, the Council has planned to generate funds through sponsorship. The Registrar also informed the house that it is a satisfactory sign that the income, during the financial year, of the Council was also increased.

**RESOLUTION NO.3**

On a motion moved by Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan and seconded by Ar. Yasmin Lari the Annual Budget was approved.

**6.0 AGENDA NO.6 APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS OF THE COUNCIL  
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2009 – 2010**

6.1 The Registrar informed the meeting that auditors of the Council are agreed to continue to work with the PCATP with the same rates for the year 2009 – 2010.

**RESOLUTION NO.4**

The appointment of auditors (Hashmi and Company) was approved with a motion moved by Ar. Muhammad Jaffar Khan and seconded by Ar. Farhat Ullah Qureshi for the financial year 2009 – 2010 on the same remuneration as in the previous year.

**7.0 AGENDA NO.7 ANY OTHER BUSINESS AS MAY BE PLACED  
BEFORE THE MEETING BY THE EXECUTIVE  
COMMITTEE OR AS THE MEETING MAY DECIDE**

7.1 The Executive Committee of the Council with a view to facilitate the members and to get optimum benefit with the use of latest technology proposed the house to organize the Extra Ordinary General Meeting of the Council at as many additional avenues as it deems appropriate. The Council observed that such meeting can be held while utilizing the video conferencing facilities, as available in all major cities of the country.

7.2 A number of architects, including Ar. Imran Farooqi and Ar. Tariq Rasool vehemently opposed the suggestion. Ar. Tariq Rasool opined that such suggestion is tantamount to make changes in the bye-laws of the PCATP Ordinance 1983; therefore, it applies the same rule as applicable for making any amendment in the bye-laws of the Ordinance. He elaborated that the PCATP rules say that the presence of 20% of overall membership is necessary to make any amendments in the bye-laws.

7.3 Ar. Imran Farooqi said that the registration of firms is the primary issue of the Council and according to Ar. Imran Farooqi, he has been repeatedly telling the

successive Executive Committees for last seventeen years to take serious action on the issue. However, he said that any such hasty move, in this regard, must be rejected.

7.4 Ar. S. Javed Nazim Shah informed the meeting that during his tenure as Vice-Chairman Architecture (2003 – 2005), the then Executive Committee had successfully brought the issue of amendments, in PCATP Ordinance, before the parliament. He asked the Executive Committee to contact the parliamentarians to find out the present status of the 1983 Ordinance. The Registrar of the Council while contradicting the assertion made by the Ar. S. Javed Nazim Shah informed the meeting that she has never seen any such file or correspondence regarding the matter at the PCATP office. Ar. Shah Muhammad Misbah also observed that no registered member of the Council is aware of any such correspondence, mentioned by the Ar. Javed Nazim Shah. Ar. Shah Muhammad Misbah had asked Ar. S. Javed Nazim Shah to provide any document for such initiative so the present Council can follow up it further.

7.5 A number of architects and town planners showed their concern over the increased recognition and power of Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC). They informed that over the period of past couple of year all big projects have been taken by the members of PEC. They observed that PEC membership has become absolutely mandatory for many departments/organizations; however, public and private entities don't even bother to recognize the PCATP registration. It was also observed that the recognition of a new academic discipline, Architectural Engineering, by the Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC) is an emerging threat to the profession of architecture and it is the need of the hour that PCATP should take stand against unethical professional practices.

7.6 Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao while responding on the issue of architectural engineering informed the participants that the discipline of architectural engineering is only considered as an allied profession and it has no nexus with the design, the primary filed of the architects. Dr. Anis also seconded the comments of Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao and informed that architectural engineering and architecture design are two totally different fields.

7.7 While responding on a comment from the floor, Ar. Arif Changezi informed that during the recent accreditation visit to Mehran University of Engineering and Technology (MUET), the PCATP team comprised of three professionals from academia.

7.8 Ar. Shama Usman, the Chairperson PCATP, informed the participants that the Executive Committee is doing its utmost efforts for the promotion of the profession. However, she recognized that the architects and town planners should standup against illegal and unprofessional practices. She stressed on the professionals to work with greater cooperation and coordination.

7.9 Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan said that engineers, architects and town planners are three different and separate professions and all of them are doing commendable job. He informed the participants that in 1983, when the PCATP came into being, it was decided that the Town Planners should have separate Council within ten years of PCATP's inception. He suggested that time has come that town planners must initiate their own Council. The participants of the Annual General Meeting whole heartedly supported the suggestion of Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan regarding the establishment of the separate Council for the town planners. A committee was also formed to initiate work in this regard under the chairmanship of Plnr. Aftab Muhammad Khan. The other members of the committee including Plnr. T.A. Jaffery, Plnr. Shehzad Haider, Plnr. Arshad Chouhan, Plnr. Mubushar Hussain, Plnr. Shahid Hassan, Plnr. Shafiq Ali Siddiqui and Plnr. Shaker Mahmood. While for the inclusion of a woman town planner in the committee, the name of Ar./Plnr. Sadia Fazli, the Registrar of the PCATP, was suggested; however, she politely refused her inclusion in the said committee.

7.10 The Executive Committee Member, Plnr. Arshad Chouhan applauded the efforts of the Council and stressed on the need of income generation. He also donated Rs. 25000/= for the Council. Plnr. Arshad Chouhan informed the participants that the Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly, Faisal Karim Kundi, is his acquaintance and he had already brought the issue of amendment in PCATP Ordinance and separate Council for town planners in the notice of the Deputy Speaker National Assembly.

7.11 Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao observed that technological advancement are primarily meant to improve the working of professionals; therefore, any such step should not be discouraged. Ar. Iqbal Mirza seconded the opinion presented by Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao and observed that the Council should adopt video conferencing facilities for any gathering. Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao also invited the attention of participants towards the depletion and deterioration of buildings having archeological significance, especially he referred the building of Visual Studies Department, located in Karachi University that was designed by known Architect Michael Ecochard.

7.12 Ar. Yasmin Lari showed her full support to the protection of archeological sites/buildings in the country. She suggested that a joint committee of the members of the PCATP, IAP and her Heritage Foundation will meet the Vice-Chancellor, Karachi University, for the protection of the building of Visual Studies Department. She appreciated the efforts of the PCATP Executive Committee and observed that the over the span of time, the Council has tremendously increased their quantum of work. She advised the Council to create an endowment fund and work more diligently for the protection and promotion of the profession and professional.
